day we received a call. 'Your dad tells me you know computers,' he said. 'Yes sir, we do.' He said, 'Mine's broken. Come fix it' - and hung up. This was a time when the forward-thinking contractors knew that these computers were going to rock their world, and they wanted people they could trust; people who could help them navigate this unknown territory.

Talk about changes! Desktop computers to calculate pay checks and taxes, AP and Payroll checks; spreadsheets for fast and accurate calculations of production rates, materials, and the many aspects of the bid process. Then access to email and FTP sites to receive drawings, submit pay apps, and more. This led to backup technology (remember the tape drives?). I remember some of the first timecard scanners — what a time-saver

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for everyone! Fax machines for faster communication, signed agreements, **and PO's. Jump to right now: we** have hosted servers; cell phones to access email, websites, Power BI reports, and games!; shared documents available from anywhere with an internet connection; video meetings **with the ability to collaborate 'live'** in the shared documents; and more!

Every now and again, one of our clients is surprised to learn we are a Full Service IT company! Perhaps our Techs have assisted their team in support of Sage 100 Contractor on their server; or they read some of our Tips and Tricks regarding Social Engineering and bank scams, but they **didn't know we can take care of ALL** of their computer-related and security needs.

## Phishing, Smishing, Vishing, and Quishing... What?

With the explosion of technology in the last 40 years, there's a whole new dictionary of words that didn't exist a few decades ago, and some have new meaning (mouse!). Here are four (4) you should get familiar with.

**Phishing:** This scam technique focuses on email. The sender is trying to get you to provide sensitive information. The email may look legit (especially with the new AI tools). They're asking for user names, passwords, account numbers; they often tell you an account is locked or

passwords are expiring, so just 'click the link' and enter the requested information. They may use the info themselves or provide it for sale on the Dark Web. Best line of defense here? Do Not Click The Links! Never provide this type of info through email, even if it looks legit!

**Smishing** is when they take the email fraud and scams to your cell phone through text messages. These links are also looking to steal information, and can even install malware such as viruses, ransomware, or spyware on the device. Often these are made to sound urgent, about a delivery, a problem with your bank, or in Larry's case, his new cell phone purchase. How to safeguard here? Do Not Click The Links! These institutions will not text you like this. If you're worried, call them!

**Vishing:** This one is all about phone calls and voicemail messages. Often these are prerecorded robocalls. Some pretty common ones are targeted at the senior community and claim to be with Social Security, Medicare, a Hospital, the phone company, utility company, an extended car warranty, and on it goes. They'll often ask for your full name, address, Drivers' license number, Social Security number, credit card details, 'just to confirm' their info. In some cases, they're trying to get you to say specific phrases, or the word 'Yes' so they have your recorded voice. Nuts right?

**Quishing:** This is a take on the resurgence of the QR code which was brought back to popularity during COVID. Similar to Phishing, it's usually an email with something they want you to do right away, but they use a QR code image instead of a URL link to click on. With this small change, it's harder for email filters to recognize the attack. Once you follow the QR code, it takes you to their site (URL) and the game is on. In this case, don't follow QR codes from an email. If you're using one in a public place (restaurant, traveling) be sure NOT to click on any links or enter any personal data. — CMW

### Ember Mug Drinkware

This has been the BEST coffee mug I've ever had! I love warm hot coffee. Dan saw me at the microwave all morning when I was in the office and gifted me this mug. No more trips to the microwave; thanks Dan!

When the kids were little, my oldest son gave me a coffee mug on a warmer plate; so thoughtful. The plate warmed the mug which had the coffee. The Ember mug has a 'plate' too, but it's a charging plate; the mug itself keeps the coffee warm so I can take it anywhere and it stays hot.

On the website I see they have some additional colors and finishes (mine's black) and even an option to personalize the mug (their advertisement said 'I love you' on a gray mug).

The charge holds for quite a while. There's a 10 ounce mug for \$129.95 and a 14 ounce model for \$149.95. It comes with an app that allows you to choose a favorite temperature and personalize a 'color' for the light. # Construction Corner



## S100C – Bank Feeds

More and more of our clients are taking advantage of the new bank feed options. **There's one for the bank reconciliation (which isn't that new), and one in the Credit Card module.** In both cases, data is downloaded directly from the bank, then you make the various updates and Account selections to process in S100C.

Very Important! Once you engage these **bank feeds and they're turned on, please** leave them. We had one client who panicked because they pulled a much larger range of dates than they meant to, and they turned the bank feed off. When they tried to turn the feeds back on, it **didn't work. We found out the only way to re-engage is through the 'backdoor' of S100C.** – CMW

## Tracking Employee Training and Licenses

There are two great tabs in the Employee 5-2-1 screen – one to track Training, one to track Licenses. There are some existing reports that pull info from these tabs, and they are quite handy. The info can also be pulled into Power BI reports, BTW.

On the Training tab, you can create a short list of common training programs across your team. It tracks Last Date, the Training Cycle (quarterly, monthly, **annual**), and the **Next Date. There's a** Notes field for additional info such as scores or ratings from training events. If the person earns a certificate or something similar, it can be attached to their record using the paperclip.

On the License tab, the structure is similar. Create a short list of licenses **which might include Drivers' Licenses, Asbestos Certifications, OSHA training certs, and similar. There's a field to track** the license number, and to track the **Expiration. Like the other, there's a** Notes field for additional info. Copies of these licenses can be attached with the paperclip in the employee record.

Jump over to the 5-1-1 report and take a look at the various reports that are available. Now you might be thinking that the people who are tracking this type of info are NOT allowed in the Payroll module; understood. However, you can allow them to run these specific reports! Open up the reports only and exclude them from the other sub-modules. **Since they don't have rights to the actual employee records, they won't** be able to drill down or see any other personal info. Or, move the reports to Power BI and set the permissions there! - CMW

## Top 10 Mistakes Construction Companies Make

**In his presentation at this year's CFMA** Annual conference, Mr. Billy Robinson with Brown Edwards CPA group, Tennessee office, shared the top 10 mistakes they see in their work with **Construction companies. Here's a recap** of what was shared.

- 1) Cash Flow: staying on top of receivables is very important; when you are underbilled, a reminder that you are financing their project!; and some things to consider regarding too much cash in the business and the exposure if there is litigation.
- 2) Inadequate Succession Planning: a reminder that there are families counting on you to have a plan; they also see a lack of communication among family members regarding what plans are in place and what to expect; there are a lot of emotions during the planning and execution of a succession plan, and these real emotions have to be considered and addressed.

3) Under investing in Report Systems and Controls: we see some of our fastest growing clients embracing new reporting tools such as Power BI; at the event, he mentioned Project Fade as margins erode due to blown budgets; the importance of a monthly WIP schedule review; and the risk of using unearned funds to pay current AP; lack of construction accounting knowledge; underestimated fraud risks.

4) Accountability: schedule meetings for a post mortem on jobs over a certain size; holding everyone to the same standards; avoid overlooking policy violations; hold clients and vendors to contract terms!

5) Equipment Investment: avoid too much debt on equipment; consider underutilized equipment; lease versus owned; staff to maintain.

6) Integrity Issues:

7) Culture and Loyalty: hold high performers accountable!

8) Growth versus Profitability: can you do the work with the team you have?; concerns for burn out of the team.

9) Professional Advisors: Spend the money and time and use them!

10) Blind Spots: Performance and Integrity as the standard versus Longevity

When considering this list, what are one or two items you could focus on as we look ahead to the end of 2024? Some of **these come down to your company's** goals and desired outcomes. Others are about being a good steward. Let us know if we can help with any of these or even just do some brainstorming with you! - CMW

## Microsoft Meet: A New Way to Connect and Collaborate

Microsoft Meet was launched in October 2020, as a rebranding of the previous Skype for Business app. It's available for free to anyone with a Microsoft account, and it also comes with different subscription plans for businesses and education. The app can be downloaded from the Microsoft website or the app store, or it can be used from the web browser.

### What is Microsoft Meet?

Microsoft Meet is a video conferencing app that lets you host and join online meetings with up to 300 participants. You can use it to chat, share your screen, record your sessions, and more. Microsoft Meet is part of the M365 suite of productivity tools, integrating seamlessly with Outlook, Teams, and other apps. It's accessible from any device, a PC, a Mac, a tablet, or a smartphone.

### What are the features of Microsoft Meet?

There are a range of features to make online meetings more engaging and productive.

- **Background blur** and custom backgrounds
- **Together mode:** See all participants in a virtual auditorium, making it feel like you're in the same room.
- **Live captions and subtitles:** Turn on live captions and subtitles in different languages, making it easier to follow the conversation.
- **Whiteboard and polls:** Use the digital whiteboard and polls to brainstorm ideas, get feedback, and collaborate with the team.
- **Breakout Rooms:** You can split your meeting into smaller groups, allowing for more focused discussions and interactions.

### Ways to use Microsoft Meet

- **Business meetings:** Host and join professional meetings with colleagues, clients, and partners, and share documents, slides, and reports.
- **Online Classes:** Great for teaching environments. There are interactive features, too.

- **Webinars and events:** Organize and attend online events with large audiences, and use the recording and live streaming options.
- **Social gatherings:** Connect and chat with friends and family. This includes fun backgrounds and filters.

### Go to Webinar, Teams, or Microsoft Meet?

When we asked Copilot what the differences were, it came down to three categories: Features, Price, and Ease of Use. Turns out that when it comes to security, they all use encryption to protect the data and user communication, and they comply with GDPR and other privacy regulations.

**Pricing:** Microsoft Meet is free for anyone with a Microsoft account, can host and join unlimited 60-minute meetings with up to 300 participants. Teams is also 'free' for anyone with a Microsoft account, host and join unlimited 60-minute meetings with up to 100 participants, with a \$5/month upgrade option. Go to Webinar starts at \$49 for the basic package, allows unlimited 60-minute webinars with each package offering different attendee limits, and upgrades.

**Ease of Use:** This was interesting. Microsoft meet doesn't require any downloads but users may find the interface and settings confusing or limited. For Teams the wording was 'cluttered or overwhelming.' Go to Webinar has an app or the browser and many attendee interaction options.
